On the point of honey, there have been a couple of reports of people buying honey which has fermented. The reason fermentation occurs is usually because there is too much moisture in the honey. It is important that the bees be allowed to ripen and cap the honey cells. They will cap the cells when sufficient moisture is evaporated off. A rule of thumb is to only harvest from frames which are at least 80% capped.

As mentioned in a previous newsletter, there are a number of items in the club's trailer which are surplus to requirements. We shall try to sort it out and make the items available to members by tender.
