At this time of the year on the coast, it is wise to inspect your hives thoroughly. Check carefully in the brood box for diseases, particularly for AFB. They could also be getting ready to swarm, so check on population growth, creation of drones, queen cells and room for the queen to lay eggs. You may need to take action to prevent this.

Honey stores may be building up, so think about adding a super or harvesting a few frames. Don't be too greedy as a week of wet weather or cold could see the bees needing to utilise their stores.

On a separate note....... Scientists around the world are becoming increasingly aware that studying bees, honey and wax is a window into environmental pollution. I have been becoming increasingly concerned by the "chain or web" created by pesticide use and such things as plastics which don't disappear but just become smaller and smaller until we call them micro plastics and so on. I may talk about this in a future newsletter.

#### FRANK'S HIVE HINTS No 18

Now that the cold weather is [all but] over you may do a bit more manipulation of the hive but take the precaution of not leaving brood out too long.

Bees may not be progressing in some hives. Check the population and brood pattern. Make sure the queen is present. If you can't find her look for eggs or young brood. Check if bees have stores of honey and pollen. Examine all brood combs for signs of disease.

Make sure strong hives don't become overcrowded or start queen cells. Sometimes bees are determined to swarm but much can be done to prevent it. Enlarge the entrance if it has been restricted. Give foundation as this is the time bees like to build rather than store honey.

This time of the year strong hives can be split but don't be too ambitious causing your strong hive to become weak. Consider the prospects for honey, pollen and the weather over the next few weeks. If nothing is coming in the hives won't prosper, bees won't build new comb and foundation will be chewed and warped. Be a good observer.

## RECENT BEE RESEARCH by UNE PhD candidate Carolyn Sonter

A molecule once used in firefighting foams in Australia and throughout the world has been found to significantly impact the health of bees, with low levels arresting their development and higher concentrations causing their death. While the use of Perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) in this country has been phased out since 2004, it persists in the environment, particularly around airports, defence bases, fire training and industrial sites. It remains unclear how bees actually ingest it and introduce it back to the hive, but theories are that PFOS may be taken up either via contaminated drinking water or plant nectar, since plants have been shown to absorb it. Once returned to the hive, PFOS impacts the entire colony and transfers to honey. Health outcomes for humans are currently unknown, but studies in animals have linked PFOS with immune system defects, including some cancers and possibly altered responses to vaccines.
