February club event feature – What you need to know about small hive beetle (SHB) with Dave Wilson

Small hive beetle is a beekeeping pest. It is endemic to sub-Saharan Africa, but has spread to many other locations, including North America, Australia, and the Philippines.

The small hive beetle can be a destructive pest of honey bee colonies, causing damage to comb, stored honey, and pollen.



If a beetle infestation is sufficiently heavy, they may cause bees to abandon their hive.

The beetles can also be a pest of stored combs, and honey (in the comb) awaiting extraction. Beetle larvae may tunnel through combs of honey, feeding and defecating, causing discoloration and fermentation of the honey.

This time of the year is when small hive beetle can be at their most destructive. Come to the February Club Event and learn from our very own Dave Wilson how to manage small hive beetle in your hives.

Secretary's Report

The last Executive Meeting was held on 29 January 2020. For your information, meeting outcomes are outlined below.

As a result of the survey from the last training course and the fact that more and more members prefer to purchase assembled boxes, lids, bottom boards and frames. Suggested we discuss removing these activities from the Beginning in Bees training course and hold 'days' where you learn to make them however you make them for the club.



- Items to be replaced in the Extraction Room identified and will be purchased.
- Transport of hives and honey frames to/from apiary site at JRAHS cost effective options being investigated.
- Swarm recipients to be invoiced for payment when they receive a swarm via the club.
- PAB Lifetime Member inaugural Lifetime member is Arthur Garske. This motion to be ratified at the 2020 AGM.

- 2020 planning:
 - Flower Power event planned for 28/29 March 2020 Sandy planning volunteers required. Arthur will judge the honey competition at the event.
 - o 2021 Calendar agreed we would organise a member 2021 Calendar.
 - Christmas in July Event agreed we would organise a July Member Event.
 - Parramatta Foundation Day agreed we would participate.
 - JRHS Year 7 Bee Event strongly agreed this was important and we would organise an event similar to December 2019 event.
 - St Ives Show agreed with member volunteers we would participate. Sandy to organise.
 - o 2020 Christmas BBQ agreed a 2020 event would be organised.
 - Agreed we would run a 2020 mead making course for members
 - o Agreed we would run a 2020 honey judging course for members
 - Agreed we would run 2020 Beginning in Bees Training Course, and will determine: trainers for knowledge sessions, AG plus one will run apiary training, standard training materials, student resources and course fee
- Geoff has agreed to be our warre hive custodian, ie, he will monitor, manage and report the progress of the warre hive in the apiary.
- All goods on offer for sale to PAB members by other PAB members (goods and services that
 are not offered by the PAB/PAB shop) must be sold through the PAB shop with the shop
 receiving 10% of the sale, eg, of late bottom boards, nucs, training DVDs have been sold to
 members.
- ABA December/January Newsletter: Measuring AFB levels in honey ABA Dec/Jan Newsletter. DW organising the honey samples, ie, from the apiary, Andrew's apiary and Dave's own apiary. Samples will continue to be collected over time.
- ABA AGM is scheduled for Sunday, 5 April 2020 in Bathurst.
- PAB will participate in the Col Pulling Comp reminder PAB were co-winners last year.
 - o Round 1: Liquid Honey AB
 - o Round 2: Club Report RA
 - Round 3: Club Promotion Pamphlet or Flier RA
 - o Round 4: Quiz Dave and Arthur are compiling guiz guestion on behalf of PAB
 - Dave and Arthur will be involved in the judging and therefore cannot take on the role as Club Coordinator
- Andrew volunteered to be the executive member who will coordinate competition items for the Col Pulling Competition.
- PAB team to complete the quiz (in Sydney). The Quiz link will be emailed to all participants at the same time. The Quiz team will have a specific period of time (say 30 minutes) to complete the quiz.
- PAB AGM to be held 8 April 2020 advice and Nomination Form to be provided to Members through the March and April Newsletters.
- Member request to assist beekeepers who have lost their hives in the bushfires. The member on behalf of Rotary are looking at funding 2,000 hives. We have indicated that we can seek member assistance to assemble hardware if materials are provided.

- Looking for more to help in with the early March extraction.

- Invitation from Blacktown Bunnings regarding speaking at their Garden Club Workshop on 'how gardeners can help the bee population in their garden, information on general the bee populations, facts about bees, what the ABA is all about and how to join.
- Commencing the 2020 swarm season newly trained PAB members will not be required to pay for their first swarm. Still required to pay for/replace boxes, frames and wax. Second and subsequent swarms will be charged at the normal charge.
- Contact from Gordon Lindsay's family. In honour of Gordon, the family will continue keeping his bees. They will join the Hawkesbury club.
- Transporting items to events/shows. Options have been discussed investigating the rental and / or purchase and storage of a galvanised trailer with high sides.
- Rather than providing the club with a percentage of credit per member transaction at Beekeeping Supplies (Granville), Azim has very kindly indicated that he would prefer to provide the club with \$200 credit for 2020. We will use this credit to purchase items for raffle at monthly club events.

- Agreed that Mentors should be easily identified and will wear a hi viz vest at monthly club events
- Agreed the 3 big ticket items for 2020 are:
 - o Transporting frames of honey from the apiary to the extraction room
 - Transporting items to public events/shows
 - JRHS Yr 7 bee experience
