CHANGES TO BEEKEEPER REGISTRATION FROM 1ST JULY 2020

Just a reminder that a new condition has come into effect 1 July 2020 requiring existing and new beekeepers registered in NSW to comply with the Australian Honey Bee industry Biosecurity Code of Practice. It is the responsibility of all beekeepers to make sure they are complying with all relevant parts of the Code to avoid possible penalties.

Summary of changes for beekeepers with less than 50 hives:

- Hives must be regularly inspected for pests and diseases. 3 brood inspections a year required, with record keeping.
- Records must be kept for pest, disease inspection and sampling.
- Recommendation (but not enforceable) for beekeepers to maintain a barrier system of hive management.

FRANK'S HIVE HINTS No 7 - Thinking of catching a swarm this coming Spring?

A swarm of bees in Spring Is worth a silver ring A swarm of bees in Summer Is worth the extra number A swarm of bees in Fall Is worth nothing at all

Usually swarming bees do not sting. Why is that? They have filled themselves with honey so they cannot bend to sting. Do you know that feeling when you have overeaten? Swarming bees are ready to build new comb. Do not give sticky combs for at least 3 days, otherwise they may desert the hive. Just give foundation or dry combs.

The larger swarm from a hive is the first one with the old queen. Subsequent swarms from the same hive will be smaller with a young or unmated queen. Sometimes two swarms join together in the air and bees destroy one queen eventually. The different swarms won't fight each other. They will join peacefully.

Don't increase or breed from stock that is known to swarm readily as this will increase the swarming tendency and you will always end up with a weak hive susceptible to disease and no honey.

RECIPE - Honey Almond Slice

Base: 90gm butter, melted

100gm brown sugar 1 cup plain flour 60gm almond meal

Mix ingredients together. Press firmly into rectangular slice tin.

Bake @ 170 degrees for 12 minutes, then cool.

Topping: 125gm butter

60gm Mid-North Coast honey

210gm flaked almonds

Melt honey and butter in a saucepan & simmer for 3 minutes.

Add almonds, then pour over cooled base.

Bake @ 170 degrees for 15 minutes.

COVID-19 SAFETY MEASURES FOR OUR MEETINGS (current 24/07/20)

While everyone is at risk of acquiring COVID-19, the more mature among our population, and those with underlying health issues, are particularly vulnerable to developing more severe symptoms and complications. For this reason, we all have a responsibility to protect one another when gathering for meetings, which will be outdoors for the time being. The following steps are to be followed as a consequence:

- If you feel unwell, and/or have symptoms, get tested and stay at home.
- If you have visited declared 'hotspots' in Victoria or NSW, or have had visitors from these areas, stay at home.
- Bring everything you need with you. At this time we can not share anything, including cups, plates, utensils or food and drink. There can be no buffet.
- When you arrive, use the hand sanitizer provided often and for a period of 20 seconds each time. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. If your hands are visibly soiled you need to wash with soap and water.
- Record your name and contact details in the book provided, using your own pen (just like you do when visiting cafes, restaurants, pubs). This is to allow for contact tracing if needed, and is vitally important to safeguard our friends, family and healthcare workers.
- Practice social distancing: you must stay 1.5m away from others. Feel free to wear a mask.
- Unfortunately there can be no handshakes, hugs or kisses as a greeting! Do the
 elbow-bump, or perform a beautiful *Namaste* (it means "I bow to you": place hands
 together at the heart, close your eyes, and bow).

Monitor your emails for changes or cancellations if conditions alter.
